Accessible Studying at the University for Continuing Education Krems

Equal opportunities for students with impairments, disabilities and/or chronic illnesses is an important concern for the University for Continuing Education Krems.

We are committed to creating framework conditions that enable equal participation in the entire study, teaching and research.

At the same time, we counteract social prejudices through information, networking and cooperation.

Our services:

- Students with disabilities and/or chronic illnesses are supported individually
- Structural accessibility in all buildings of Campus Krems
- The course directors and the disability officer are the direct contact persons who can be approached by students with disabilities during their studies.
- Specially design courses (e.g. block courses, e-learning) facilitate barrier-free studying.

Advice for prospective students

Starting a degree course is a challenge for every first-year student. For students with a disability or impairment, however, studying is usually even more challenging. In a joint discussion with the Disability Officer for students, you can clarify how a barrier-free course of study is possible for you, whether you meet the admission requirements for the desired course of study, what proof you need to provide and what funding options are available.

Compensation for disadvantages

Universities have the legal duty to create accessibility- in access to buildings access to buildings, in teaching and in communication. Wherever accessibility is not guaranteed for all, appropriate precautions must be taken. In order to compensate for impairment-related disadvantages during studies, compensation for disadvantages must be provided to ensure self-determined and independent study.

Compensation for disadvantages during studies and examinations can include:

- Alternative examination methods (e.g. oral instead of written examination or extended deadlines)
- Work implements or technical aids
- Study and communication assistance
- Literature service for blind and visually impaired people
- Appropriate arrangements in courses

You can obtain further information in a personal meeting with with our Disability Officer.

Target group

Our support services are aimed at all students who experience a disadvantage during their studies due to:

- disabilities
- physical or motoric impairments
- sensory impairments
- mental impairment
- chronic diseases
- autism spectrum condition, ASD
- reading and/or spelling difficulties
- or as the case may be

Study visits and internships abroad can be decisive for professional success. We are happy to advise and support you in planning a study visit or internship abroad. We will get in touch with the Disability Officer at the foreign university, arrange for a contact person on site and support you in finding suitable accommodation. We will also help you apply for grants or scholarships.
