

What we learned from you

- High expectations. SSC's necessity is obvious but what for?
 - Control transitions and challenging and reframing status quo.
 - Give a reality check to science/policy/management.
 - Enhance collaboration/crossing borders
 - Give science a voice
 - Bring together excellence and <u>relevance</u>
 - Expectations from GTdC: Showcase SSC to society
- Main Issue 1: How to bridge the gap?
 - o Metadisciplinary challenge first: Systems thinking → Systems definition
 - o Educational divide: Too much knowledge, too little understanding
 - o Know our limits: bio-psychological, cultural, social, disciplinary, perspective...
 - Play with science. Permeate society with science as with music.
- Main Issue 2: Whom to talk to? ...and how?
 - o Involve who needs to be involved, give voice; who decides? → Project ownership
 - Get the right people and get them motivated. Make sure those motivated are the right people.
 - Is the Td-P a democracy/participatory/a forum/a council/what else?
 - Valuation of practice and lay knowledge. What's the added value?
- University as a facilitator → Science Communicator/Mediator
 - The ivory tower (funding, publication mill, research questions) as chance and challenge.

- Education for transdisciplinarity




Dissemination
